**ORDER OF REEMPLOYMENT ASSISTANCE APPEALS COMMISSION**

---

This case comes before the Commission for consideration of an appeal of the decision of a reemployment assistance appeals referee holding the claimant not disqualified from receipt of benefits because she did not fail without good cause to accept an offer of suitable work since no work had been offered. The referee's decision advised that a request for review should specify any and all contentions of error with respect to the referee's decision, and that contentions of error not specifically raised in the request for review may be considered waived. The Commission has jurisdiction pursuant to Section 443.151(4)(c), Florida Statutes.

Having considered all arguments raised on appeal and having reviewed the hearing record, the Commission concludes that the referee sufficiently followed the proper procedures and the case does not require reopening or remanding for further proceedings. The referee's material findings are supported by competent, substantial evidence. The referee also correctly applied the law in deciding the case.

Section 443.101(2), Florida Statutes, provides for disqualification from receipt of benefits if, among other things, the Department of Economic Opportunity ("Department") finds that the individual has failed without good cause to apply for available suitable work or to accept suitable work when offered to him or her. The statute specifies that in determining whether work is suitable for an individual, the Department must consider the degree of risk to the individual's health, safety, and morals; the individual's physical fitness, prior training, experience, prior earnings, length of unemployment, and prospects for securing local work in his or her customary occupation; and the distance of the available work from his or her residence. *Id.*

The hearing record in this case reflects that the claimant voluntarily separated from employment on April 1, 2019, to accept employment outside the field of education, and that she had not applied for or been offered employment with this employer since her separation. However, even if the claimant had refused a subsequent offer of work from this employer, she did so for other employment and thus would have had good cause to turn down the offer. Section 443.101(2), Florida Statutes, is intended to disqualify individuals who are unemployed but fail to apply for or accept suitable work when offered. It is not intended to apply in this fact scenario where the claimant has acquired work with a different employer. Accordingly, the referee correctly held the claimant not disqualified on this basis.

Although outside the scope of this appeal, a review of Department records reveals the claimant's April 2019 voluntary separation was never adjudicated, presumably because Department records reflect she earned sufficient wages in her subsequent employment to remove any disqualification penalty prior to filing her March 22, 2020 claim.<sup>1</sup> When a claimant voluntarily separates to accept other employment, a contributing employer is relieved of benefit charges. This employer, however, is a reimbursing employer for whom relief from charging is inapplicable. So that the employer may be aware of what benefits were paid, we note that the claimant filed her claim for benefits in March 2020 after a layoff from her subsequent employment in a plastic surgeon's office due to the COVID-19 pandemic. The claimant claimed and received six weeks of benefits, then became reemployed and stopped reporting on her claim. Although the claimant filed another claim for benefits effective April 11, 2021, she did not claim or receive any benefits on that claim. Consequently, the claimant was paid only six weeks of benefits during the COVID-19 shut-down in April and May of 2020.

<sup>1</sup> We surmise that the employer may have contested benefit payments to the claimant on her March 22, 2020 claim by asserting that she voluntarily quit employment in April 2019, when continuing work was available, which may have resulted in creation of the suitable work issue under review in this case.

The referee's decision is affirmed.

It is so ordered.

### DECISION OF APPEALS REFEREE

**Important appeal rights are explained at the end of this decision.**

**Issues Involved:** FAILURE TO APPLY FOR OR ACCEPT WORK: Whether the claimant failed without good cause to apply for suitable work as directed by the Department or one-stop career center or accept suitable work when offered, pursuant to Section 443.101(2), Florida Statutes; Rule 73B-11.019, Florida Administrative Code.

Findings of Fact: The claimant began work as a school clerk, for the SCHOOL BOARD OF A FLORIDA COUNTY, the

claimant resigned to pursue other employment and she separated from the employer on April 11, 2019. The employer did not offer the claimant further work.

Conclusion of Law: The law provides that a claimant who fails without good cause to apply for available, suitable work when so directed by the Department or one-stop career center or to accept suitable work when offered will be disqualified for benefits. For a refusal of suitable work to occur, a genuine offer of work must be made and received.

The employer's witness was the human resources records specialist. The testimony of the records specialist shows the employer did not make an offer of work to the claimant. Therefore, the claimant is qualified for benefits.

Decision: The determination dated September 2, 2021 is AFFIRMED. The claimant is qualified.

If this decision disqualifies and/or holds the claimant ineligible for benefits already received, the claimant will be required to repay those benefits. The specific amount of any overpayment will be calculated by the department and set forth in a separate overpayment determination, unless specified in this decision. However, the time to request review of this decision is as shown above and is not stopped, delayed or extended by any other determination, decision or order.
